



# February 18, 2023 Capital Area Unity Round Table

# Facilitated by Nancy J and Elizabeth D

Initial Topics: Tradition 2 and Concept 2

#### **Tradition Two:**

For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority - a loving God as he may express himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

The final responsibility and authority for NA services rests with the NA groups

One member's experience with Tradition and Concept Two:

- Service is an honor and a personal experience.
- Diversity comes also in the form of experiences and perspectives.
  - o Diversity isn't a strength unless we recognize it and cherish it.
- Step work lays the groundwork for other services.
- Group conscience is not just applicable in NA meetings, but other NA events and services.
  - More than one member coming together to identify different ways to carry the message.
- Group conscience is not uniformity.
  - o There are often multiple ways to get to the same destination.
- New doesn't just mean new to NA; it could be new to the Area or a group.
  - o Good ideas and perspectives don't solely come from longstanding members.
  - By allowing people to feel safe sharing their perspective and by groups listening to the minority opinion, we can get better.

## **Second Tradition and Concept Q&A Discussion**

- 1. What is a conscience, and how do I get in touch with mine? What does group conscience mean to me, and how do I participate in it? What is the difference between the group conscience and my individual conscience?
  - a. The feeling of rightness or wrongness internally

- 2. How does participating in group conscience help develop my sense of a Higher Power? How do I allow my Higher Power to influence my decision making? What helps me cultivate that influence?
  - a. Sometimes it may look like sharing something that you have a strong conviction about and stepping out of the way for other people to make the decision.
- 3. How does my understanding of open-mindedness help me apply the Second Tradition? How do I encourage or welcome the ideas of new members? Do I consider the needs of views of those who aren't in the room? How do I find the courage to ask difficult questions in business meetings?
  - a. We won't move forward and grow without new ideas.
  - b. These can come through considering topics during quiet time.
- 4. How do we invite a loving Higher Power into our decision-making process?
  - a. A reminder that the discussion at hand often doesn't \*need\* to be decided right now. We can often discuss more than once or over a period of time so we can provide everyone the opportunity to come to their decisions.
- 5. What is our shared understanding of group conscience? Is it the same as or different from a majority vote or consensus? How does our group establish a group conscience?
  - a. We need to have everyone involved and not exclude anyone.
- 6. Does a service body have a group conscience? How do we exercise group conscience in service? How do we invite a loving Higher Power into our decisions?
  - a. One member does believe that service bodies have group conscience like homegroups, and we invite a loving Higher Power into our decisions by inviting more people into the conversation.
- 7. What does a good group conscience process look like? What would an observer notice about decision making in our service body?
  - a. One member believes "good" means healthy, and we can create a ground to flesh out our disagreements and conflicts.
- 8. How best do we involve groups in our process? How does our work impact other service bodies? What's the relationship between communication and Tradition Two?
  - a. Not relying just on one point of contact (like an Outreach chair) to visit meetings and ensure they have what they need.
  - b. One-way communication streams aren't effective here we need discussion and back-and-forth.

# **Concept Two**

- The most important title I have in NA is "Member."
- If groups are not at the service body, they cannot provide direction for the service body.
- Area Service Committee was set up to provide services on behalf of groups, to do things that would be difficult for homegroups to do themselves.
- We don't cut off those that aren't participating, but their participation is still essential.
- NA is not a business practicing spiritual principles; it's a spiritual program practicing business principles.
- One of the best ways in service bodies is to have a planning session to identify group needs and establish a way forward to meet those needs.

## **Money Matters**

- Donations and contributions do not mean the same thing.
- When we contribute to and invest in NA, we contribute to ourselves, other addicts, and our message.
- We can do more together with more involvement.
- Area, Region, and World all provide different services that would be difficult for smaller bodies to provide.
  - o All our literature and translations comes from World Service.
- It takes individual accountability to be prudent with NA funds and we can assist other addicts by not holding onto funds (past a prudent reserve).
- Question: What to say to meetings that are having trouble supporting themselves?
  - o Struggling groups don't see people from Area supporting these groups.
  - Why don't we send Area money to groups that are struggling?
    - We want these groups to come and tell where the need is so that something can be done.
    - Fully self-supporting means more than just providing finances.
  - o There's accountability for the Area treasurer by having multiple signatories.
  - The idea of fund-flow comes with the idea that there are additional funds to fund flow – it's not an expectation of groups who don't have excess funds after expenses.

- There are several options for gathering support for a meeting (GSR responsibilities, constant sharing about needs, etc.)
  - Opinion: If groups still do not have attendance after requesting support for a significant period of time, it may not be satisfying a need for the current area.
- Question: What to say to groups that don't trust Area?
  - o Any service body puts safeguards in place.
    - Deterring people from misappropriation of funds
    - Idea is for people to feel comfortable with deterrents.
    - Including accountability so that any wrongdoing is uncovered very soon.
  - We've all done regrettable things in the past and we shouldn't hold service bodies at fault forever for individual decisions from the past.
  - You can send anyone (as a GSR-proxy) to Area it doesn't even have to be monthly. It could be as regularly as you can make it. But not having a GSR does not mean your group can't have a voice at Area.
  - Individual members have had the experience of having Area be divisive and problematic.
    - Service bodies don't work with perfect efficiency and getting things right all the time.
    - There are some things that get done that can't get done any other way.
      - Online meeting list, H&I meetings in your institution, phone lines
    - Things get messed up sometimes, but Area (and larger service bodies) still help homegroups carry the message.
    - In the past decade we have had 3 misappropriations of funds 2 were fully repaid and one was partially repaid. Consideration: What do we want to focus on here?

# Disruptive Behavior – Discussion and Q&A

- Discussing the Violent & Disruptive Behavior IP, including strategies to address these behaviors.
- One member sharing about why violent and disruptive behavior in our Area needs to be addressed.

- These also include behaviors such as preying on newcomers and vulnerable people, sexually or otherwise.
- Discussion that there is likely more benefit to have predators leave than to close the meeting – meetings shouldn't have to close because of individual actions.
- o Members can feel excommunicated or no longer welcome when these things happen to them, and other members don't address it seriously.
- Necessary for men to call out other men.
- Moving away from victim blaming and moving towards believing victims
- o Addressing topic of what the "signs" are to look out for
- Solutions sourced from NA and other 12 step programs:
  - Utilizing candid language calling behavior what it is and not making it more palatable.
  - Educating others of what is and isn't acceptable and what to be done about
     it
  - Discussing how groups incorporate language into their format proactively.
  - Discussing: What can calling out your friends' behavior look like?
  - Ad-hoc committee on researching what predatory behavior looks like in meetings, what can be done about it, and creating a hotline.
    - Ad-hoc can provide resources with support.
  - Having workshops on what predatory behavior looks like
  - Creating and maintaining culture and support for each other.

#### Discussion

- Largely what happens before and after meetings that contribute the most to members not feeling safe – less so what's happening during the meeting itself, though still possible.
- o People not feeling safe in meetings is a common experience.
  - Could be purposeful, could be people that think their behavior is acceptable when it isn't.
- Suggestion of speaking to people that appear to be getting closer to someone who
  is identified to be an active predator.
- Suggestion of speaking to someone's sponsor to inform them of their sponsee's behavior.

- o Men are often unaware of how their behavior affects women.
- o It's often triggering to be around violence and sexually inappropriate behavior, especially when people don't know the effects their behavior has on other people.
- We're responsible for our own recovery, but that doesn't mean our behavior doesn't have an impact on other people.
- Our conversations need to evolve our existing literature doesn't solve every problem.
- o Not feeling safe contributes to women not being in our meetings.
- o Drugs are the main problem, but they're not the only problem.
- o This isn't a problem exclusive to young women, but all women.
- o It's the responsibility of the group and the members within to maintain the safety and atmosphere of recovery at a meeting.
- Encouraging people to embrace the discomfort and talk about these things –
  talking to men and women about their behavior, but also talking to men and
  women about healthy boundaries and what is and isn't acceptable here in NA.

# General Q&A

- How does one get NA-approved literature?
  - o CAR report includes topics that could make it to the WSC for what literature gets decided on.
  - On the regional website, we have links to provide feedback for the CAR report including new literature.
  - Na.org/survey
- Idea: Having a planning meeting once a year (around May/June) to define what our services for the coming year will be
  - Facilitated by NA members that have professional experience in this regard.
    - "Strategic Planning"
  - o Benefit: We can be assured we're delivering services our homegroups want.
    - Most people will support their own ideas.
  - o Benefit: Allows us to prioritize, delegate, and act upon
    - Allows us to measure how effective we are in our services.
